Many mountain pastures boast a log cabin offering tasty seasonal refreshments. Some mountain pastures also provide accommodation so that visitors can stay the night.

In winter, the most popular log cabins are those dotted along the ski slopes and cross-country trails. Increasing visitor numbers underline the importance of actively managed mountain pastures—both as a space for tourism and for recreation.

However, Austria's unique cultural landscape can only be preserved and kept accessible if cattle are driven up the mountains in summer and farmers continue to manage the alpine pastures. We therefore invite you to support us in maintaining a strong and sustainable partnership between Austria's tourism industry and farming communities.


